Goals

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| 1. | Expand number and diversity of arts exposure experiences available for selection by schools and develop more thorough evaluation process for assessment of their effectiveness |
| 2. | Expand the reach and impact of the current program by inviting two new school districts to contribute to and participate in Any Given Child arts education programming already in place |
| 3. | Expand number and reach of professional development workshops to include Common Core, inquiry-based, and arts integration topics using regional and Kennedy Center Presenters |
| 4. | Continue to produce 6-week residencies for 25 classrooms in Twin Rivers and Sacramento City Unified School Districts, while increasing arts integration capacity of school and artist teams |
| 5. | Select a new fiscal sponsor to replace the Mayor's office oversight of Any Given Child funds until structure for permanent governing structure can be developed. Return all programming administration to Friends of the Arts Commission. |

Planning meetings were held to fully relocate Any Given Child as a program of Friends of the Arts Commission as of July, 2013 in order to address and coordinate more effective fundraising, marketing, advocacy and governance strategies for the program.</p>		<p>Governing Council, Friends of the Arts Commission, and SRCF throughout the year, though fundraising, marketing and long range planning were inadequately addressed through existing structures. A transfer agreement was successfully negotiated and approved to completely move the program to Friends of the Arts Commission's governance with existing Any Given Child collaborative partners seated on the Friends' Board or Committees.</p>
