VISION AND GOALS

It is the vision of Madison’s *Any Given Child* Community Arts Team that all students have access to a comprehensive arts education with inclusive, diverse, and integrated learning in all art forms every year.

1. Cultivate leaders and develop and sustain systems that support high quality arts education as an essential part of a well-rounded education for all.
2. Create arts-rich schools that support and sustain quality arts education as an essential part of a well-rounded education for all.
3. Cultivate a community network that supports and sustains quality arts education as an essential part of a well-rounded education for all.
4. Develop an accountability system that tracks and reports *Any Given Child* Madison progress in providing accessible and equitable arts education to all students.
5. Advocate for arts education as part of a well-rounded education and essential to developing the creative economy in our community.



OUTCOMES

- In June 2016, the first-ever Midwest Arts Integration Conference, co-sponsored by the Innovative Schools Network and the Kennedy Center, was held at the overture Center for the Arts in Madison, WI with a team of 50 arts liaisons and teachers from the Madison Metropolitan School District in attendance.
- In December 2016, the Foundation for Madison’s Public Schools approved a plan to create a development position within their organization. The Any Given Child Madison Development Manager position will be finalized in January 2017, and this new position will begin in Spring 2017.
- In January 2017, all Madison Metropolitan School District K-8 schools completed the “Arts Rich Schools Rubric” to obtain baseline data that will be used as part of the *Any Given Child* Madison data to set new outcomes for the 2017-2018 school year.
- 15 professional learning opportunities were presented through *Any Given Child* Madison, reaching 233 teachers directly. Additionally, Madison Metropolitan School District Arts Education offered three professional development opportunities for arts educators and reached 245 additional participants. 90% of all participants learned new skills to enhance their ability to connect/integrate the arts with teaching other subjects.
- In August 2014, *Any Given Child* Madison received a \$125,000 gift from the estate of Carl M. Hudig to support the goals created by its Community Arts Team.
