Through this Seminar, teaching artists will know the components of effective lessons, see them reflected in a lesson template, and apply their new understanding to their own teaching. Through participation in a sample lesson, lively discussions, activities, and presentations, teaching artists improve their lessons **to better facilitate student learning**.
